

## **Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Guidance for Candidates**

It is your responsibility to make sure you comply with any instructions from your test centre regarding COVID-19 procedures.

### **COVID-19 Procedures:**

Centres have been asked to provide you with clear information about procedures before, during and after the test.

These include:

- Any mandatory measures you need to take, such as health checks and additional hygiene procedures. (E.g. temperature checks, mandatory mask wearing etc.)

Please note, you can be **refused entry** if you fail to adhere to any mandatory restrictions or requirements.

### **You cannot take the test if you:**

- display symptoms of COVID-19 - [https://www.who.int/health-topics/coronavirus#tab=tab\\_3](https://www.who.int/health-topics/coronavirus#tab=tab_3) - this link is to the World Health Organisation. Please follow guidance from your local authorities.
- are under 14-day compulsory quarantine, stay-at-home order, medical surveillance or a self-quarantine order, as specified.
- have been in close contact with a person with known or suspected coronavirus within the last 14 days. Close contact is defined as spending more than 15 minutes face-to-face contact within 2 metres of a person known to have coronavirus OR living in the same household as a person known or suspected to have coronavirus.
- have recently travelled to places restricted by your local authorities.

If you cannot take the test because of any of the reasons above, you can cancel your booking through UniversItaly:

- You can cancel your test booking and receive a full refund at any point up until **23:59 Italian time on 27 August**.
- If you cancel your test after **23:59 Italian time on 27 August, but before 9 September**, you will receive a 25% refund.

### **On the test day**

- If you turn up on the day but cannot take the test due to displaying COVID-19 symptoms (e.g. after a temperature check) the centre will inform Admissions Testing who will provide a full refund.
- You must follow all required COVID-19 procedures set out by the test centre.
- You need to be aware that if you leave anything behind after the exam (such as forgetting a pencil case), these items may be thrown away or destroyed for hygiene reasons. You must make sure you take all your belongings with you when you leave the venue.
